

#### The Bishop's Article from the September 2023 Edition of The Spirit



#### From the Bishop:

I went to the musical 1776 a few nights ago where I learned some new things about how the Declaration of Independence came to be written. As I watched, I felt proud to be an American – to be part of a group

of people who wanted freedom from tyranny, freedom to vote, freedom from an empire far away.

There were also moments in this play when I was horrified at some decisions made. At the last minute, the clause to abolish slavery was removed so that all of the representatives would sign the document. The most powerful song in the musical, Molasses to Rum, reminds the audience how all the colonies were complicit in the selling of humans – not just the south. (https://genius.com/John-cullum-molasses-torum-lyrics)

As an American, I hold two realities. First, I rejoice in the wonder and aspiration of the United States of America. I am grateful for this country and I love what it is striving to be. At its best, it is a country where freedom and liberty are supreme. It is a place where care is given to those arriving on its shores. It is a place where people can freely go to church and other places of worship (or not go at all). In short, the United States is a promise of what can be.

At the same time, I hold the truth of this country's sins. Enslaved men built the White House, the U.S. Capitol building, and others. Homes of former presidents including George Washington's Mount Vernon and James Madison's Montpelier were built by men "owned" by them. The land that we in the Northwest Washington Synod are living on was once land that belonged to Samish and Duwamish, Lummi, and Muckleshoot and many others. Japanese people were unjustly imprisoned during World War II. Sundown laws and redlining laws were written throughout this country. As a white woman, I know that I could not vote until 1919. For women of color, the right to vote did not come until later. People who are part of the LGBTQIA+ communities have been harassed and discriminated against, beaten up and killed in this country. And discriminatory practices and violence continue to this day. In short, the systems in this country have violated and harmed

people since its inception.

This is what it means to be an American: to vote, to engage in civic society, to appreciate this country, to grieve past and present sins, and to truthfully stand up and speak when it falls short of its ideals.

But what about those of us who are American and also Christian? Unequivocally it means that as much as one might love this country, this is not where our ultimate allegiance lies. For we are part of the body of Christ that extends beyond the borders of any country. As Lutheran Christians, we know that we are named, chosen, and called by God through Jesus. We hold deeply the joy that we are freed from sin, and, because of this, we are called into radical love, acceptance, and welcome – far beyond being a citizen of any country. We are freed to live beyond racism, injustice, and bigotry. Martin Luther wrote that freedom is a gift from God, not just for our sake, or our country's sake, but for the sake of the world.

Tragically, there are those who want to distort this freedom. To somehow merge Christian and American identities. Rather than freedom, conflating religious authority with political authority leads to tyranny and marginalization - especially of minority groups. Christian Nationalism is neither patriotic nor is it faithful. You do not have to be Christian to be a "true" American. And you do not have to be American to be Christian. At its heart, it is idolatrous. As the First Commandment states, "You shall have no other gods."


Together, as faithful Christians, let us live into Jesus' words –into radical love, acceptance and welcome. Let us speak truth to power and stand with those without power. Let us follow Jesus who commands us to love everyone as our brothers and sisters and siblings including our fellow citizens, those of other belief systems, and those of other nations. Together, as faithful Christians, let us stand up and speak out against Christian Nationalism and any system that marginalizes, harms, and subjugates another. As Jesus announces in the gospel of Luke, 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because God has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. God has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.'

For freedom Christ has set us free. May we live and dance and revel in the freedom of Christ.

#### **Family Promise**

The mission of Family Promise of Skagit Valley is to "come together as a community to support homeless families as they work to provide their children with loving homes. Local congregations serve as hosts for sheltering families and a Day Center providing support services, assisting parents to achieve stable employment and housing. Since 2016 this program has prevented the homelessness of 138 children. The Skagit Valley group is one of over 200 such projects in the United States.

CLC member, Rev. Laurin Vance was instrumental in starting this program over ten years ago. He still serves on the Board of Directors.

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Grace and peace to you as we approach these holy days ahead!

In my work with congregations in transition there is always a question on their congregational profiles that asks how this congregation "sees yourself" in relationship with both the Synod and the ELCA. Most of the time, the written response is about how much money the congregation gives and that they come to gatherings like the Synod Assembly. All of this is of course true...but I wonder if the words "see yourself" is probing for something at a different level.

Please permit me to share from my own place but please know that congregations should have the opportunity to share from their own place and in their own words. For me, participation in the larger church is about the communal nature of who God is *and* about God's hopes for the way we will see our relationship with the whole of God's creation. Many of you have probably heard me preach about how in our creation story God almost had a mantra for all that God made...that "it was good"...but that there was one place when God actually says that something "is not good." God said that "it is not good" (Gen 2:18) that the human one would be alone. This not only tells me about what God dreams about...but about God Godself...that community is inherent to God. I understand that participation in ways of doing ministry, beyond myself and the walls of my own congregation, is because I understand that the ministry is much larger than what I simply participate in...much larger than what is in front of me....and that participation in this larger ministry is just as real a ministry as what I have the capacity to participate in myself or even have the capacity to understand. This is why I give to it...this is why I participate in it.

Thanks for your commitment to the larger thing of what we define as "ministry." I hope that you see that even though we might be able to do this without you...that it really would not be the same without you...because of the ways that we "see you" in relationship. The Synod is not just an Office. It is the commitment of us doing ministry together. The ELCA is not just a denomination. It is the commitment of us doing ministry together. So, thanks not only for your mission support...but I am thankful that we can share in this ministry together in all its forms.

For this I truly give thanks...not only to you...but also to God!
