Christmas at Home During a Power Outage



I find myself sitting here in the house on day four of the November power outage. No internet at home or church and I can't get anything to come up on my phone. No calls out or in, they won't go through. Texting is all there is. All that said, there is still plenty I can do. In fact, I just heated up some hot water on the Coleman stove for glazed lemon loaf tea as I am trying to be healthy. Yes, it really smells and tastes like a lemon loaf or an imagined one. Anyways, while putting some books away I found an old Holden Village Voice magazine from 2016 and read the first of a series of articles on the theme Home.

The article written by the then directors, Peg Carlson-Hoffman and Chuck Hoffman raise several questions and statements or thoughts about what home means. What does home mean to you? Really, take some time to think about that question. Where is home? Who is present at/in a home? Does home mean the same thing now as it did when you were a child? Again, what does home mean to you? I won't tell you their answer in the article because I will be bringing some of those thoughts out during our Advent Mid-week services this year and Christmas eve. (Yes, the Spirit is stirring a Christmas Eve sermon almost one and three quarters month ahead of time. Maybe, at least). However, here are a few lines in the article that may leave you scratching your head about how they connect with home. Think about them in connection with home anyways. They may expand or contract your thoughts on home. *"Our world seems filled with words and images of violence and anger, power in the worst sense of the meaning, and venomous attacks by people in power. All are ingredients that have been stirred into an unhealthy pot of hatred. Harsh words filled with fear are creating a very narrow and hard edged world."...* *"You are a unique inhabitant of your own reality in how you interpret the world around you."*... *"Thomas Merton discovered that our true self is found only in relation to the whole, which is the mercy of God."*... *"Proverbs tells us that it requires wisdom and understanding to establish a home."*

What does home mean to you? This will be part of our journey this Advent season leading us into Christmas when Jesus comes to make his home among us.

The Bishop's Article from the December 2022 Edition of The Spirit



From the Bishop:

I took the quilt to the cleaners to get washed. They looked at it and handed it back. If we touch this, they said, it will fall apart.

To most eyes, the quilt is nothing to look at. The bright yellow ducklings have long faded to muted colors. The binding is frayed. Happy, my dog from childhood, chewed holes in the fabric where stuffing came out and repair was never finished. (Happy did this to many sheets and blankets in my growing up years. My sisters and I called them "Happy holes." My mom did not.)

From the time I was a toddler, this quilt has held my laughter, tears, secrets, sleep, insomnia, sickness, health, anger. In darkness, this quilt surrounded me in warmth. Years later, my children were wrapped in this same quilt.

Long before my grandma quilted my "duckie" blanket and gave it to me, there was a young family without permanent shelter and a baby soon to be born. The village midwives came into the night to help birth a baby for a family unknown. They came to an unhoused couple, a foreign couple, a poor couple with no prospects or power. And yet, these midwives left their warm houses and their own families, bringing their own handmade blankets and strips of cloth as they participated in this baby's birth. And, when he was born, they wrapped this child and his mom in warmth.

We know this because we hear the angels' words to the shepherds, "This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.' Surely if the baby was wrapped in bands of cloth, the child was also wrapped in blankets.

What a difference it would have been without these blankets, without these swaddling cloths,

without these midwives. Without the skills and the gifts God gave to them. The vocation of midwife brought Jesus into the world. The hands and wisdom of these women wrapped him in swaddling cloths.

It is such an amazing story ... through God's invitation, and from Mary saying yes and Joseph saying yes and the innkeeper saying yes and the midwives saying yes – Jesus came.

Two thousand years ago, in a way no one could have imagined, God was with us in human form. Wrapped in blankets. Held in love.

What love, what grace, what beauty. Amazingly and almost inconceivably, in this little baby, God's love came and God's love continues to be among us through Jesus – Immanuel, Incarnate, God-in-the-flesh love. Embodied love ... for you and for me. Always.

I know that life is messy. Life is sometimes hard. Sometimes the world seems out of control and we are so small against so much of what is out there. And yet ... through something as small and vulnerable as a newborn baby, we are promised that God is here. Amongst us. And God's love is for everyone. Absolutely everyone. Regardless of your job or your political party, your anxiety or your income. Your ethnicity, your language, your gender, your situation in life. God's love is for you who celebrate this holy day and God's love is for those who don't. God's love is for those you are estranged from and those you embrace.

This Christmas and this year, may you feel surrounded by God's love and presence. In your laughter, tears, secrets, sleep, insomnia, sickness, health, anger - in darkness and in light may you feel God wrapping you into God's embrace ... like a worn, faded blanket that is covered in ducks and Happy holes.

Stewardship Moment - Ways to Give

Did you know?

IRAs:

- If you are at least 70 ½ years young you can contribute funds directly from your IRA to Camano Lutheran Church.
- This is known as a Qualified Charitable Distribution or QCD.
- Such amounts are excluded from your taxable income up to \$100,000 per calendar year.
- A lower taxable income may have significant tax advantages for you, including reducing or avoiding Medicare premium IRMAA surcharges.
- Most IRA trustees will transfer funds on a regular schedule per your request – i.e. monthly, quarterly, semi-annually.
- You may ask our bookkeeper (Teresa) to report your contribution in one lump sum or evenly over a specified number of months.
- Furthermore, you may designate how the funds are to be applied – i.e. general offering, building fund or specific benevolence.

Appreciated Stock:

- You may donate appreciated stock to Camano Lutheran Church.
- Contact our bookkeeper for instructions on executing a stock transfer directly into Camano Lutheran's brokerage account.
- A direct transfer avoids the capital gain realized if the stock had been sold.
- We will liquidate the stock and transfer the money to our general cash account.
- You may designate how the funds are to be applied – i.e. general offering, building fund or specific benevolence.

Online Giving:

- Online giving is convenient, easy, time-saving and resource conscious.
- Use it for single donations or to set up scheduled auto payments – e.g. weekly or monthly
- Your scheduled auto payment may be split between General Offerings, Building Maintenance, Benevolence of the Month (BOM) and church planting.

(While Advent is a season of hope and Christmas is a season of joy, not everyone feels hopeful or like celebrating. Grief, illness, aging, depression, loneliness, unemployment, and loss are magnified. Even those who are not struggling with losses may feel the stress of preparations and expectations around Christmas time. A Longest Night/Blue Christmas service may provide a time and place of solace during the often frenetic days surrounding the celebration of Christmas. We come together seeking healing and room to share grief, sadness, loneliness, or confusion when these emotions often feel out of place during the holidays.

In the Northern Hemisphere, December 21 is the longest night, the winter solstice. It marks the shortest day of the year, the official start of winter. Tradition says that nature and all her creatures stop and hold their breath to see if the sun will turn back from its wanderings, if the days will lengthen and the earth will once again feel the sun's warmth. On this darkest day of the year, we come with our honest yearnings seeking the return of light and hope.)

SEPTEMBER - OCTOBER 2022 CLC PROPERTY TEAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

1. Secured hallway cabinets to Preschool walls for safety.
2. Replaced bulb in Small Sanctuary overhead hanging light.
3. Spent a day accompanying our contract HVAC firm (Andgar) during our annual furnace/ac maintenance service.
4. Drilled holes and placed raceway for the new telephone service.
5. Installed Cat 8 cable in several rooms.
6. Spent numerous hours attempting to control the hornet nesting problem near the east parking lot wall. Finally successful.
7. Worked with our contract Fire & Safety firm (Pye-Barker) during the inspection and maintenance of the kitchen overhead stove vent hood.
8. Spent time with our contract electrician when he installed new electrical outlets in Child Care and the large sanctuary. He also repaired "dead" outlets and placed child proof outlet covers where needed.
9. Repaired lower rail on the recently modified fencing along the south office walkway.
10. Installed two carbon dioxide detectors in the Child Care building.
11. Landscaped bushes were significantly cut back.
12. A new ballast was installed in the entry hallway near the kitchen.
13. Moved tall bookcase back to the Preschool hallway and secured to wall.
14. New telephones on order will require access to an Ethernet cable. In locations with a computer, the new telephone will share the computer Ethernet cable. We have four other telephones in locations without a computer, two in fellowship hall with access to Ethernet cable, and two in childcare without access to Ethernet cables.
15. The fellowship hall main door sometimes requires a little key movement to open. Worked on it and it did work better. Let us know if it gives you a problem.
16. Was asked to put a knob back on one of the doors for the food storage closet in fellowship hall kitchen. Seemed like an easy task. Turns out the bolt threads were damaged. Discovered threads were also damaged on the knob. New knob and bolt installed.



BATTERY OPERATED CANDLES NEEDED





Guisela is a single mother living with her two daughters in the remote hills of western Guatemala. Without a regular source of income or the knowledge to work the dry, lifeless land, she struggled to provide a daily meal for her children. She made long daily treks to fetch clean water for her family, hauling heavy containers back up steep terrain to her home. This time-consuming effort left little time for gardening, and with little farming know-how, she often paid the high cost of transportation to buy vegetables for her children at the nearest market. Since prospects for women in this area are few and far between, earning money was difficult. The cycle of poverty seemed impossible for Guisela to break.

But your love changed everything. Your generosity is delivering seeds, tools and mentorship. Because of you, Guisela has learned to farm and now has an abundance of healthy and nutritious food to offer her growing children.

Brenna and her siblings grew up in an unpredictable environment with parents that were addicted to substances. Because of this volatile home, Brenna ran away when she was only a pre-term, causing her to experience homelessness. Living on the streets at a young age left her vulnerable to severely unsafe people and situations. She was abused mentally and physically. Some years later, she fled an abusive relationship with her child and found housing at Housing Hope. She worked closely with her Family Support Coach and has now completed College of Hope courses and Kindred Kitchen's training program. She continues to work through the trauma she experienced. She has big dreams of becoming a doctor. Because of her ambition, dedication, and support system, she is on her way to achieving that goal by enrolling in pre-med courses at the local community college.

Because of donors like you, participants like Brenna have a safe space to call home. Your donation helps provide the programs that Brenna and her children have accessed while living at Housing Hope.
