Reflections with Pastor Scott Easter Continues

It's easy to forget that Easter is more than a one-day event, but a 50 day season in the church year. Actually, it's much more than a 50 day reality as the resurrected Christ is present in our everyday life. Amidst the daily difficulties that come in life and the emotions that go with them, one can forget, if for only a moment, the resurrected Christ walks with us every minute of every day. As I have walked some difficult paths lately with congregation members, community members and grieving the deaths of Joan Vogue, Inez Hushagen and my friend Ron Yarnell, I found the following devotion helpful. It is written by Lilly Lewen and comes from Godspace, a daily devotion I receive. I hope it can be a blessing for you as well.

I have often wondered about the week after the resurrection. I have lots of questions.

I wonder and am curious about the reactions of the disciples and the emotions they carried this week. The emotions that the disciples and followers of Jesus had during Good Friday and beyond.

They were exhausted and afraid the day of the Crucifixion. They proved they couldn't stay awake and pray with Jesus in the Garden. Then all but John and the women left Jesus to die on the cross among the jeering crowd and the soldiers rather than with his friends. They couldn't bare to watch...they were scared they would be next.

Only Nicodemas, and Joesph of Arimathea, the tomb giver, and again some of the women were the only ones to see him buried. The Disciples didn't leave the room. After all it was the sabbath day and it was really against the law to travel. They stayed put...except for Thomas.

One of my questions is about the Pharisees. Why did the pharisees and the chief priests believe that Jesus would be raised while his disciples didn't? They asked Herod for a guard on the tomb. They asked Herod because they wanted to be extra careful. They actually remembered what Jesus said about rising from the dead on the third day. Hum ...I never thought of that til this year. Had the Disciples forgotten? Was their disbelief that Jesus was killed too great and it stopped them remembering? Was it their deep grief? Or was it exhaustion that blinded them and made them forget or at least misunderstand? More likely it was deep fear that they would be next and they just couldn't deal with that.

⁶⁵ 'Take a guard,' Pilate answered. 'Go, make the tomb as secure as you know how.' 66 So they went and made the tomb secure by putting a seal on the stone and posting the guard. Matthew 27:62-66

I wonder.

I wonder what my exhaustion keeps me from seeing and from remembering? What does my fear blind me to or keep me from remembering?

⁶² The next day, the one after Preparation Day, the chief priests and the Pharisees went to Pilate. ⁶³ 'Sir,' they said, 'we remember that while he was still alive that deceiver said, "After three days I will rise again." ⁶⁴ So give the order for the tomb to be made secure until the third day. Otherwise, his disciples may come and steal the body and tell the people that he has been raised from the dead. This last deception will be worse than the first.'

How often do I forget what Jesus has said and what he has done for me in my life? What are you feeling this week after Easter?

Are you still in the land of Good Friday and the room of extended grief? There is a lot in our world that is frustrating and painful.

This week after Easter saw another mass shooting. Another group of co-workers shot down and killed by a person, a young person, with an automatic rifle. This was in Louisville, KY, just up the road a few hours from Nashville. Kentucky is

Tennessee's northern neighbor, so close to home again. This sickens me and makes me want to escape and hide, just like the disciples..escape the conflict on gun control and the lack of will to change in our political system to stop all of this!

But then there is Jesus....resurrected Jesus. Jesus bearing the scars of his agony. Defeating death by sharing in it! And sharing in all our sufferings.

Jesus comes into that stuckness

Into that fear

Into that exhaustion

Into that grief

Jesus walks through the walls they have built and the doors that are shut and says

PEACE BE WITH YOU!

DON'T BE AFRAID!

Mary was not afraid to go to the tomb, but she was shattered once she arrived. Mary came to anoint the body and add more spices. Thinking her friend, her teacher, her Lord has been removed by the enemies, the body lost somewhere, she weeps.

Blinded by grief. She thinks the gardener might know where they've taken Jesus.

But then there is JESUS and Jesus calls her name.

MARY

She is Seen

She is Known

She is greatly loved.

As Mary runs from the tomb..."I HAVE SEEN HIM"

I need to remember that Jesus knows my name too. I need to remember that Jesus can see me in my tears, in my grief, in my stuckness and blindness.

Jesus sees me in the rooms I've locked away. and JESUS LOVES ME right where I am!
JESUS LOVES ME ANYWAY!

And Jesus calls me by name!

Maybe like me, you need Jesus to call your name today.


Maybe you too need to remember that He loves you so much!

What things are you fearful about today? Give them to Jesus to hold for you.

What things are making you anxious or frustrated? Allow Jesus to have these things.

Imagine Jesus coming into your house to be with you right where you are...

He says to you "PEACE BE WITH YOU"



He shows you his hands and his side.

He isn't afraid of your doubts.

He sits and eats with you and reminds you of his love for you and your calling. Picture the scene. Allow the love of Jesus to surround you!

To help you remember, Make a list of how you've seen Jesus work in your life in the past.

Consider the people and the places and experiences you've had that you know were God inspired.

Keep adding to your list in the days and weeks ahead.

Lord Jesus help us see and remember all the wonderful things you've done in our lives.


Help us to know you are with us! In our grief, our pain, in our frustrations and discouragement.

Help us to know you love us right now just as we are

Help us to hear your voice and receive your peace again.

We need your peace and your love now more than ever.

Fill us again with your Holy Spirit. We love you! AMEN



They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. He said to them, 'Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? 3 Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have.'

⁴⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet. ⁴¹ And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, 'Do you have anything here to eat?' ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate it in their presence.

He said to them, 'This is what I told you while I was still with you: everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms.'

Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. ⁴⁶ He told them, 'This is what is written: the Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷ and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹ I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.' From the Bishop:

Some synonyms for GATHERING that I found on the internet include: association, caucus, collection, conclave, conference, congregation, convention, crowd, function,

group, mass, meeting, party, throng, acquisition, affair, aggregate, aggregation, band, body, bunch, clambake, company, concentration, concourse, congress, convocation, crush, drove, flock, gain, heap, herd, horde, huddle, junction, knot, levy, meet, muster, parley, pile, rally, roundup, society, stock, stockpile, swarm, turnout, union, gettogether, social function.

Some of these GATHERING words sound positive to my ears (group, party, social function), some sound political or corporate (caucus, acquisition, convention, meeting), some sound a little scary (crush, drove, horde, swarm) and one just makes me smile (clambake). How is a clambake like a GATHERING? I'd love to hear your answer!

We are excited that this year we are having two GATHERINGS. As a congregation, you are welcome to choose either May 13 or May 20 to GATHER with people throughout the synod. While there is no limit on the number of people who may attend from your congregation, we do have to cap registration at 300 each Saturday, so we hope that you are coming and that you are already registered as you read this! At these two GATHERINGS we will have ample opportunity to learn together, laugh together, share information together, collaborate together, sing and play together, eat together, engage in possibility and vision-thinking together, pray together, plan

For too long we have tried to do things alone. For too long we have tried to figure things out on our own. For too long we have not looked to others for collaboration and community. But Ecclesiastes 4:9 reminds us, "Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up the other; but woe to one who is alone and falls and does not have another to help."

These last few years have shown us that there is nothing better than GATHERING with the body of Christ, especially in-person. We are excited for all of us in our synod to come together as we share our God-given gifts and wisdom. We are excited for the knowledge that will be shared and, even more, the Spirit of hope, generosity, and anticipation for what is next.

We are excited to see you and your congregation at one of the GATHERINGs this year. We can't wait to GATHER together with you on May 13 or May 20 and into the future!

MARCH 2023 CLC PROPERTY TEAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- 1. Sink drain cleaned in ladies toilet in Child Care.
- 2. Pressure washed sidewalks (removed mold and grime) adjacent to the Office doors and out to the parking lot.
- 3. Changed fluorescent lights in hallway near Office.
- 4. Full time mowing for entire field areas started.
- 5. The door closure mechanism on the most used office entrance door failed. The adjacent (seldom used) door closure was used to replace it, and the failed unit was sent to a firm in Florida for possible repair or replacement. A new equivalent unit would be over \$600 and a repair of the existing one is \$310. Repair is pending.
- 6. The "Burn Pile" in the NW field has been accumulating yard waste, branches, tree limbs, grasses and more and the time had come for disposal. A burning permit was obtained and water hoses were linked from the Fellowship Hall to the burn site to comply with the requirement for charged hoses. A full time attendant was required for monitoring the fire. A forecast for calm winds (< 7 mph) provided the opening for ignition and a full burn with little smoke. This took most of the day (3/28/23) to reduce the pile and ensure there were no remaining hot spots.
- 7. A live evergreen tree, used during an earlier Christmas service, was moved from a temporary holding site and planted in the lawn area by the Preschool and office.
- 8. Small ants reappeared in the large sanctuary and a non hazardous pesticide was applied judiciously.
- 9. The large trees adjacent to the north sheds had significant wind damage and were hazardous. Limbs and parts of trunks were removed.

Allen Gilbertson Remembrance

Allen Gilbertson devoted more than fifty years to Camano Lutheran Cemetery. Fifty years is an incredible amount of time when you realize that in the 1970s, the Seattle SuperSonics battled the Bulls, *Jaws* was a favorite movie, *Hitch-hikers Guide to the Galaxy* a bestseller, and *Happy Days* a popular TV show. We used phones with cords (usually one per house) and no one we knew owned a personal computer.

It is impressive that Allen Gilbertson dedicated fifty years to the Camano Lutheran Cemetery but that is not what makes his devotion so remarkable. It is the fact that every day, every single day (unless he was hunting), Allen tended to the cemetery. He not only did not miss a day, he could be seen at the cemetery two, three or more times a day. In the 1980s and '90s he shouldered almost complete responsibility for the cemetery. In his last fifteen years, Allen also visited Gilbertson Funeral home every day checking in on his good friend, David Brandt, sharing the latest news in Stanwood.

And what did Allen do all these hours, each and every day? He checked on the general condition and needs of the cemetery. He arranged, supervised and paid grounds care workers. He met with people and showed them possible grave sites, marked graves, communicated with the cooperating funeral homes, kept the cemetery records, oversaw cemetery meetings, and maintained the financial records. He listened to those with complaints and accommodated those with special requests as he was able. Whatever needed to be done, Allen did it.

An example of his diligence was once he was trying to top a tree and the trunk split and sent his body flying 35 feet, snapping his femur in two places. Later, upon hearing that a tricky grave was being dug which might impinge on a burial site next to it, Allen insisted, wheelchair and all, on sitting next to the open grave. He oversaw and supervised while the diggers did their work to make sure the grave was dug correctly.

But what Allen really did best was to keep the stories of those who were buried there. Our entrance sign reads, "... buried here are many of the original pioneers and Camano Island community members." Allen knew those people and knew their stories and often their secrets. Lucky was the person spending the day with Allen at the cemetery listening to fascinating tales of yesteryear.

They say an animal, instinctively, knows the measure of a man. We can say for certain that our Australian Shepherd, Auggie, thought that Allen was the most wonderful person in the world. She would wait each morning for him to arrive on our porch for the morning cemetery update, and would jump, and bark, and twirl and smile as he approached. He always had a good word, a warm pat and a friendly smile and always a special treat for her. Auggie thought Allen was beautiful. Allen was a kind man and a friend, and he is very much missed. It is important that we dedicate this new site in Allen Gilbertson's memory, for he made a difference, and we should never forget his story.
