Reflections with Pastor Scott

Do You Bring Love With You



I give you a new commandment, that you love one another, just as I have loved you, you should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.” John 13:34-35

This is part of the text for the 5th Sunday in Easter. We read it together during worship in May. It was the focus of an online devotion I did as well, and I thought I would share what I asked people to think about regarding Jesus words around love.

When it comes to all the “crap,” meaning anxiety, fear, anger, hatred, violence, etc.. going on in the world, the love Jesus speaks of and lives out is the best answer to all of it. Love is so simple and yet so complicated and difficult to live out. Think about it. How easy is it for you to live out love amidst the big “isms”, “political battles”, “religious battles”, “war”, violence and the list goes on and on of realities we deal with daily in our lives? From what I witness and experience myself, it is not easy at all!

So, I want to put before you a text on love that gets “stuck” at weddings and often isn’t thought of outside of weddings. Side note, the text was not focused on weddings when originally written. It is 1 Corinthians 13:4-7. It reads, *“Love is patient and kind; love is not jealous or boastful; it is not arrogant or rude. Love does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrong but rejoices in the right. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.”*

Using this 1 Corinthians definition of love, let me ask you, do **you bring this love** with you before all those realities above? Those realities that stir up such ranker, bitterness, hatred and violence from the lips and actions of so many in our society, ourselves included at times. Do you bring this definition of love with you on discussions and actions around racism, politics, sexuality, religion, faith, the environment, poverty, homelessness, economics, stewardship...hopefully you get the picture of what I am pushing you to look at in connection with what you bring to these discussions and actions? Do you bring this love with you? None of them are easy topics in today’s world and Christ’s love can change the words, emotions and actions we bring with us.

My ask is simple, yet difficult. Be as honest as you can with yourself. Look deep within with as much honesty as you can muster and ask, “am I bringing love with me into the difficult areas of discussion and life in today’s world.” Or are you bringing something else with you? Pride, desire for power, self-righteousness, all the answers according to you. Are you bringing Christ’s love? If not, maybe use this definition as a guide to help you engage these realities differently in the future. We will fail and stumble along the way to be certain, but Christ will be right there with these words from Corinthians and people following the heart of Christ to lift you back up to try again. Everyday we are renewed through Christ in the waters of our baptism. Thanks be to God!

The Bishop's Article from the June 2022 Edition of The Spirit



From the Bishop:

Today I walked my dogs. As I was walking, one person told me how beautiful my dogs were. (I agree!) Another person told me they were so glad to see the sun. (Me too!) Another mock-yelled after

me when I didn't greet him, "Hey! Aren't you going to say hello?" (I smiled and waved.) I love my neighborhood in South Everett. I especially love that there are several languages being spoken in the homes surrounding mine: there is a multitude of ethnicities, there are different religious expressions, children's voices are heard at all hours of the day, and there are different food smells wafting out windows at dinner time.

Even as I experience belonging and love for this neighborhood, though, I am also aware of the troubles and heartaches here. A little girl was hit by a car and died here a few years ago. People have been affected by COVID. Rising prices are causing some to not be able to live here. People who are renting are being forced out when landlords decide to sell. And there are people affected by meth, domestic violence, and so much more behind the walls of the homes in my neighborhood.

I think of all of us in the "neighborhood" of the Northwest Washington Synod and how I love our neighborhood. I love the diversity we have in our synod. I love the different geographies, landscapes, languages, ethnicities, cultures, and foods in our synod. As I journey through the 110+ congregations and ministry sites of this synod, I am aware of the deep joys and crushing sorrows, and the connections and the loneliness that surround us. Much like my little neighborhood, there is diversity and there is belonging here. And much like my little neighborhood, there is loss and there is grief and there is difficulty. We cannot ignore that there

are thorny and deep-seated social and relational complexities within us as a church and in society as a whole.

Holding the "both/and" of this reality – the true joy and the deep sorrow and frustration – is why the theme for this year's 2022 Synod Assembly is abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Now let me say this: While it is true that some may look at our theme, "Abound in Hope" and assume that we are naively optimistic or positive. Others may look at our theme, "Abound in Hope" and think that we do not understand the mountain that we must climb. Still others may look at our theme, "Abound in Hope" and wonder how – with the pain Church has caused many or the sins of our ancestors – that we are only living in the present and not acknowledging the past. To those, this is what I say:

We are abounding in hope. And because we are abounding in hope we are invited into complex and difficult conversations through the power of the Holy Spirit. We are able to face the realities of life today - knowing that we are not alone. We do not ignore or downplay or pretend that there are not sad and horrifying realities in our world today. We fiercely hold on to the hope that comes only through Jesus. And, knowing this, together, we are called to be, share in, and live into the good news that comes through our risen Savior Jesus. And so ... we are **abounding in hope.**

I am thankful to be living in this neighborhood of Northwest Washington Synod with you.

May we abound in hope through God's Spirit living in this world and into God's future.

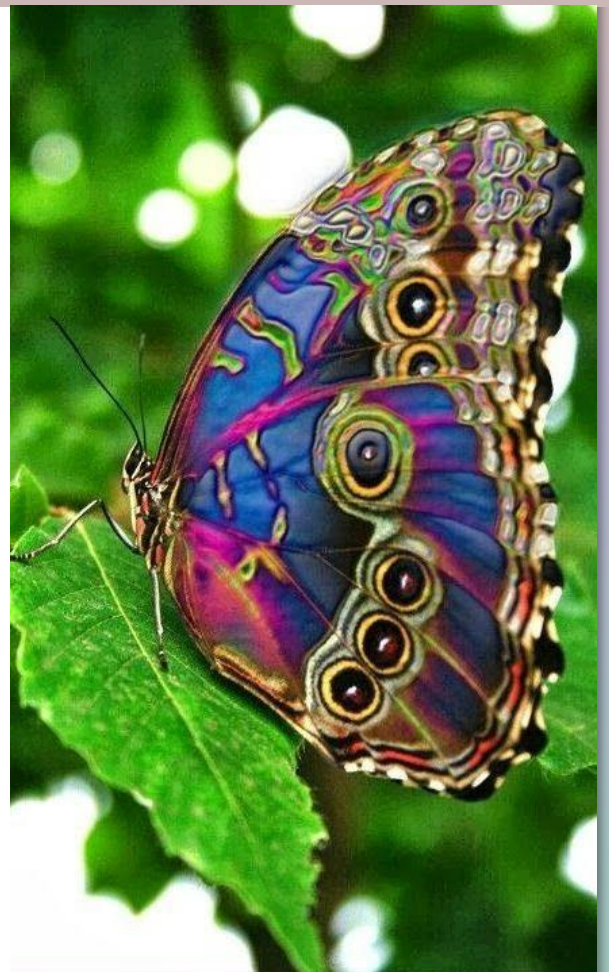

APRIL 2022 CLC PROPERTY TEAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

1. Several expensive Child Care toys that had been damaged by vigorous use were repaired.
2. Old bushy "lipstick" plants were dug out (late season frost victims) and replacement ones were planted.
3. New hanging plants were put up.
4. Installed a new gate hinge spring and auto latch closure on the inner fence around the playground. This was one requirement that came from the recent inspection. More of these closures will be installed based on the good results from the this test model.
5. Spread bark mulch around the plants outside and below kitchen windows.
6. A new begonia was added to the plaza, exterior water hoses were hung, faucet frost covers were removed and taken to storage.
7. Mowing full time resumed with the advent of spring rains and rapid growth. This productive effort requires the most work-hours from the Property Team and we are fortunate to have people willing to take on this task. Thank a mower when you see one!
8. Determined the reason the Fellowship Hall main door would not unlock from the outside. A locksmith was contacted and we await a professional repair/replacement.
9. Childcare boy locked the restroom door from inside and then left. Removed outside door handle to reopen and allow access.

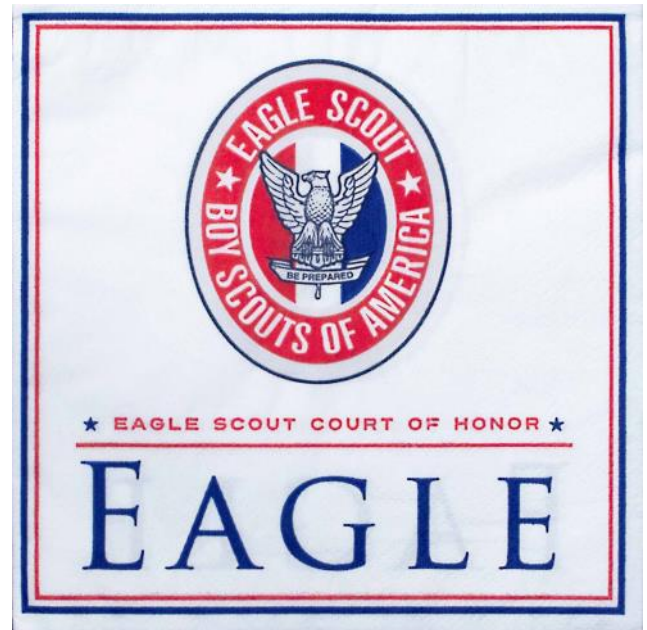
WHERE ARE THE GABRIELSONS?

Mission Aviation



Aviation Christian Ministry *Help, Hope and Healing for the isolated...*

How can they call on Him to save them unless they believe in Him? And how can they believe in Him if they have never heard about him? And how can they hear about Him unless someone tells them? Romans 10:14 NLT

Using Airplanes... to bring the Love of Christ to the ends of the earth.

Training... Mission Aviation Training Academy

Mission Aviation Training Academy (MATA) in Arlington, WA. For 20 years MATA has trained and equipped evangelical Christian pilots for mission aviation ministry, including meeting qualifications for major mission organizations and training directly for service with smaller aviation ministries. There is a serious shortage of pilots serving in remote locations around the world, where aviation is the most practical means of transportation for church planters, Bible translators, health care workers and patients, and disaster relief efforts. MATA trains pilots to help meet the shortfall of missionary pilots in order to spread the Gospel farther and faster. It takes approximately 10 years to adequately train a pilot for aviation ministry.



Camano Lutheran Church supports David Perkins in aviation training at MATA. David is an Information Technology computer specialist that assists our church with computer needs as well. David and his wife have a heart for the isolated communities in Alaska. They serve as support missionaries to a Christian Radio station in Naknek, Alaska. David routinely travels to the remote bush to assist in technical computer management at the radio station and remote radio repeaters. He is asked to fly into villages and work on equipment as well as fly supplies, people and or pastors to church services or Christian camps. David also travels with his wife Laura to help with summer activities like children vacation bible school in isolated villages.



David is currently working on an advanced commercial aviation rating which will allow him more flexibility to assist the mission team in Alaska. Thank you for your support and prayers as he and his wife share the Love of Christ to those isolated and hurting beyond the roads in bush Alaska. Aviation is the only way to reach most of the state of Alaska. Naknek is located at the start of the Aleutian chain of islands on Bristol Bay.

Sending... Mission Aviation Fellowship

MATA trains and prepares pilots for sending around the world. Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) is one of the primary aviation ministries where students join after completing the training. MAF Aviation ministry concentrates on the rugged, hard to reach, difficult places that others can't reach or choose not to. MAF aviation pilots must be of the highest standard due to meet the demands of this Aviation challenge.

MAF was founded in 1945 and has Aviation ministries in over 30 countries around the world in Africa, Asia, Eurasia, and Latin America. MAF partners with churches, relief organizations, medical teams, missionaries, and medical emergencies to bring help, healing and hope to those who live in the most isolated parts of the world. MAF flies over a million miles each year saving valuable time in ministry, relief efforts and medical transport.

The Aid organized in 1896 with the following "Mrs." as charter members: J.P. Larson, Emma Graham, Sivert Johnson, K.P. Frostad, Nils Bodin, L.T. Land, Elias Land, Olena Domerude, John Nordenberg, John Einarson, Annie Frostad and Thomas Thompson.)

LWR distributed its first quilts in 1945 to families in war-torn Europe following the Second World War. Within a decade, the ministry was reaching around the globe to villages far removed from the world's attention. Today, an average of 300,000 quilts are lovingly given worldwide each year. Quilts can be used as warm bedding, simple tents or floor coverings.

LWR Mission Quilts are highly regarded throughout the world because of their quality and consistency.
