

Pastor Scott's Clergy Stole

"Neither Height Nor Depth"

Proposed Clergy Stole Design for

Camano Lutheran Church

Camano Island, Wash.

Sept 25, 2025

It has been a delight to design this proposed clergy stole for Camano Lutheran and your Pastor. What I propose to you here somewhat distills the many, many ways your Pastor and his long-standing, impactful ministry with you could be described.

From the scripture of Romans 8, a favourite of Pastor Scott's, the title, "Neither Height nor Depth", is one of the ways that we cannot be separated from the love of God. It is also true that Pastor Scott loves the outdoors and this sacred island home. I have used the heights of tall evergreens, the Pacific Coastal Mountains, and the tall steeple of the church to indicate the heights. The bright blue and green curved dip on the left indicate the opposite - the depths of the ocean nearby, and deep, fresh living waters. Between the two is the rolling hillside that is the beautiful setting for your historic church.

We look up at your historic church, its white cladding and tall steeple with the cross on top. The windows glow with warm activity inside. The doors are thrown open because Jesus Christ teaches us that just as he did not come for himself, we are not part of Christian community for the promotion of ourselves. Rather we are called to serve others, and with the constant invitations from Pastor Scott, Camano Lutheran Church serves the wider community in so many beautiful and life-changing ways, from quilt-making and meal preparation, to tithing, childcare and chapel, and finding ways that the Holy Spirit can take the blessings of an open table into community.

Flowing out of the open doors, symbolizing all these things, are the symbols of a chalice, broken loaf of bread, dove of the Spirit, and quilt squares.

Initially I had drafted more things flowing out of these doors including a baseball, bat, fork and casserole pot. However, this simplified version feels less busy to me. These symbols, shown in light yellow-green, could be both added to, or removed, such as with the quilt squares, should you wish to keep the symbols purely sacramental.

The doors of the church are deep red to mirror what I see as burgundy coloured doors of your church.

The rest of the stole design holds various greens, from the light green in the sky to the bright greens of the foreground to show the vibrancy of your congregation; a vibrancy that includes both mountain top experiences and deep dark valleys.

Through all these things we are not separated from the love of God. We are one.

From the Bishop:

March 2026

We are living in times that would have felt unimaginable just a few years ago. We are surrounded by neighbors who are worried about sending their kids to school, seeking medical help, or gathering for worship – afraid of what might happen. We are also surrounded by neighbors who are anxious about people from other countries or people of different religions – uncertain about a changing world and unsure where they belong. Many people are afraid. And this fear, in all its forms, is shrinking our world.

Fear pulls us inward. It isolates us from one another. It tempts us to retreat into suspicion and guardedness rather than reaching out toward one another. It makes it harder to see one another as fully human. It becomes almost impossible to say that we are all beloved of God and all neighbors with one another. Truly, as followers of Jesus, we are called to a new way: a way of connection, courage, and community.

During this time of Lent, as children of God, let us practice these new ways through the disciplines of prayer, fasting, and charity (the traditional disciplines of Lent).

Prayer: Let us pray together for this world. Let us read scripture together and attend mid-week Lenten services. Let us light candles each night. Let us listen to one another's fears and longings. Let us gather on street corners and sing. Let us gather in churches and homes – and even in front of federal buildings. Prayer grounds us so we remember who we are and whose we are. Let us gather in prayer this Lent.

Fasting: You are welcome to give up luxuries during Lent – but fasting also invites us to examine what consumes us and what we consume in return. What are we holding onto that causes us not to see our neighbor? What holds our attention more tightly than the people right in front of us? This Lent let us choose practices that connect us rather than separate us. Let us fast from doomscrolling and performative outrage and instead read thoughtfully and be genuine in our allyship. Let us make space for joy, for creativity. Let us not only fast from junk food but let us prepare good, nourishing meals for those who are without. Let us fast expansively this Lent.

Charity: This is not simply about writing a check (though sometimes this is a faithful use of resources). Charity is also showing up. Let us share time, attention, and care. Let us reduce our focus on hoarding wealth or possessions and instead practice love for our neighbors in tangible ways. Let us use our voices for those who have been silenced. Let us help redistribute wealth so that those who are without receive what they need. And let us stand in solidarity with communities who are vulnerable. Charity makes visible Christ's love we proclaim. Let us show the love of God and neighbor through charity this Lent.

These practices alone cannot change the world – but we believe in One who is already changing this world. And so, as we practice these disciplines, we also live in the promise that the Holy Spirit is alive and active in this world. And that even in this fearful time, death does not have the final word. Through Jesus, God is always bringing hope out of despair, community out of isolation, life out of death. As people shaped by the promise of the resurrection, may we dare to live differently – to pray boldly, to fast with freedom, to give generously. May the Holy Spirit strengthen us during these forty days and beyond. And may our lives bear witness to the new life God is already creating among us.

From the VEEP:

“Then Jesus told them a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart.”
(Luke 18:1)

My congregation loves the Holden Evening Prayer service. We use it for special evening services, but also during Sunday morning worship. It is beautiful and uplifting. Every time we use it, however, I am reminded of a misunderstanding one of my children had about the prayers. Never having had any experience with incense (they were quite little), they thought the song said, “Let my prayers rise up like insects.” Insects they had lots of experience with - they had seen gnats and mosquitoes swarming about and rising up into the air, so this made perfect sense to them. I didn’t realize what they were singing until they were singing it in the car after church. Of course, I had to stop them and explain the error, but in reality, I kind of like their imagery - not one prayer wafting lazily up to God, but dozens or more tiny little prayers buzzing about the Godhead.

It reminds me of the parable of the persistent widow in Luke, chapter 1. Jesus tells the story of the widow who kept coming to the judge to ask for justice against her accuser. The judge was not a righteous man and was inclined to ignore her. However, she does not back down. She keeps bothering him and wears him down until he finally gives in and gives her the justice she seeks. Her persistence pays off. In this same way, Jesus says, we should pray all the time, over and over and not lose heart because God is just and so will grant justice to those who cry to him day and night. Let our prayers rise up like a swarm of insects, too numerous to ignore.

What I love about this parable is that Jesus tells us it is okay to make nuisances of ourselves. We don’t have to worry about annoying God with our prayers; we are actually told to pray always - unceasingly. We don’t need to be afraid of praying too much or in some wrong way. Just keep praying. Make a joyful noise to the lord. Make lamentations. Plead. Praise. Question. Be a gnat, a mosquito, a locust, a wasp, a butterfly - just keep praying.

Keep praying and don’t lose heart. Sometimes that second part is really hard to do. Every morning when I wake up, I’m afraid to check out the daily news. So much of it is bad: floods, earthquakes, droughts, volcanic eruptions, wars, gun violence, bigotry, corruption, persecution, inflation, government agents killing citizens in the streets - the list just goes on and on. It can seem like all that praying is getting us nowhere, that God is impervious - wearing super strong DEET or something - but I have faith that is not true. God hears us and does not swat us away. However, we are also called to act in addition to prayer. We pray for justice but we must also act for justice, however scary and dangerous that might be. We can be as persistent in our actions as we are in our prayers. Volunteer to help in food pantries, donate to disaster relief, show up in support of immigrants, call/write/email/visit your lawmakers, join rallies and vigils, support local schools and libraries - there are many ways to make our presence seen and felt. Let not only our prayers, but let us rise up like insects pestering our way to justice.

Here’s what I or the synod council have been up to in February:

- The Synod Policy Review Team met on February. Among other policies, we reviewed a new policy for crisis communications.
- The Synod Executive Committee met on February 12. Among other agenda items we made an appointment to the Personnel Committee.
- The Seminary Debt Reduction Committee met to review application and make grants.



- ...Closing of the CLC Preschool
- ...Resignation of newly hired Childcare Director
- ...Loss of several long-time members
- ...Financial downturn resulting in utilizing funds from 2 month operating funds reserve

Gratitude for the positive outcomes & blessings of challenges:

- ...Supplies & equipment from preschool were utilized in CLC Childcare & other community organizations
- ...Ashli French, 7 year employee of CLC preschool accepted position as Director, Childcare & has hired additional staff that work well together. She continues to focus on building our reputation and enrollment.
- ...The community of CLC responded to request for prayer; recognizing that all is a gift from God. Our 2 month operating reserve has been replenished.
- ...Heating system in Pioneer Hall was replaced. Stilly River Mechanical honored a bid that was from early 2025. Cost was less than anticipated.
- ...Vacated classrooms transformed into dedicated space for Kid's Church, meeting rooms
