## Reflections with Pastor Scott

### And the February Benevolence of the Month



Back in June of 2021 our cluster partnered with the ministry One Parish, One Prisoner (OPOP). It was the focus of one of our worship services in June and a team from our cluster churches was created to engage this ministry. The heart of this ministry is to befriend a person in prison called, "Our releasing friend." The idea is to write letters, emails, visit and when our releasing friend is released from the prison, we will be there to help them get their new life started and continue the friendship and support into the future.

Our releasing friends name is Kelly and we have included him in the prayers each week during worship. He was scheduled to be released in June of 2022. Thankfully for Kelly, he is being released from prison early and will wear a monitor until his official release date in June. He will live in a place for those awaiting their "official" release date having served his sentence. He will be able to work during this time and begin his new life journey.

This is a "mutual transformation" relationship in which we are engaged. While I will be focusing primarily on the things that Kelly needs upon his release, this has been and will continue to be a mutually transforming relationship. Kelly is bringing his open heart, vulnerability, honesty about who he is and this gives us the opportunity to listen to his story and learn something about the prison industrial complex, its brokenness, how we are all in need of grace, etc. This will be a relationship of continual mutual growth and learning.

What is our role as the OPOP team? First and foremost, to be Kelly's friend while he is in prison and continue that friendship when he is released. It may be hard to imagine, when one is released from prison, they have very little of the things needed to start their new life journey. This is especially tough if one has no family to help with this new journey. They need a place to live, a job which can be difficult to find with time in prison on one's record, food, clothes, a vehicle to get to work, getting a new driver's license, building a supportive network that helps build the person up and several other realities we probably take for granted. That is where the rest of our role comes in, helping Kelly with all these needs to give him a start.

Unfortunately, a few of the people that started with our OPOP team from the cluster had to discontinue being part for this ministry and the gift of responsibility has been placed in our care. With other members unable to continue, that left all CLC people and Deacon Le Brandes. CLC members are Paul and Charlotte Shoup, Jon Hamlin, Jennifer McFall and Pastor Scott. Kelly continues to be very open to the program, deeply thankful for the friendships that are being made and deepened and he wants to continue after his release. Kelly is ready to get to work and be a part of a community of support.

So, what are we needing for this benevolence of the month with Kelly getting out very soon?

+Funds for finding a place for Kelly to live and get started until his first paychecks give him the means to pay rent and support himself. (Many places now require much more than first and last month's rent)

+A vehicle in good shape to get him to and from work and dealing with the daily needs of life. (Do you have a car or know someone who has a car that can be donated or offered for a very low price?)

+Clothes (Gift cards or funds are best)

+Phone

+Food to get started

+Funds for all those little things one needs to get started. Just pause and imagine you have no money and no family to help, what are the things you need to get started again as you start from nothing.

This is our benevolence of the month focus for February and we hope you can help. You can donate online or send a check and write in the memo Benevolence of the Month OPOP or just OPOP. When I read these words from Matthew's Gospel, I can't help but see many of them being lived out in this ministry. It is a real way to engage what Jesus calls us to engage.



*<sup>31</sup>“When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. <sup>32</sup>All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, <sup>33</sup>and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. <sup>34</sup>Then the king will say to those at his right hand, ‘Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; <sup>35</sup>for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, <sup>36</sup>I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.’ <sup>37</sup>Then the righteous will answer him, ‘Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? <sup>38</sup>And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? <sup>39</sup>And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?’ <sup>40</sup>And the king will answer them, ‘Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.’*



## The Bishop's Article from the February 2022 Edition of The Spirit



### **From the Bishop:**

I don't usually write about personal things for this monthly column, but I have a birthday this month (it is not a significant birthday – it doesn't end in a zero or a five)

but a birthday is a birthday. And a birthday is always a blessing – it is a marker that we are still given time on earth to be with loved ones, work to make this world more livable and loveable for others, learn and grow, listen and speak, play and dance in God's Spirit of love.

I remember a significant birthday ten years ago that I celebrated. It was very low-key birthday. My parents and my family were there. We had some sort of food that I don't remember and a cake that was probably chocolate. That was it. But I was so thankful to be celebrating it. You see, in the summer of 2011 I was diagnosed with an aggressive form of breast cancer. I underwent chemotherapy, a bilateral mastectomy, and radiation. In February of 2012 I had finished chemo and surgery and was just beginning radiation. (I am perfectly healthy now.)

This is what I wrote on my blog on [www.mylifeline.org](http://www.mylifeline.org) exactly ten years ago:

*The other day I was complaining to some friends that it is hard for me to get motivated. I said, "I am not a depressed person but it is so hard to do things right now." My friend Laura said to me, "Maybe it's because you are battling cancer and have had months of toxic drugs, major surgery, forced work leave, a little too much mortality staring you in the face and no hair or eyelashes. Personally I think that's enough reason to feel what you are feeling." ...*

Today I re-read what my friend Laura said and her words hold true for me and for so many of us right now. For many it is hard to be motivated and do things right now. We have had months – years! – of a pandemic, political divide, anxiety, forced separation, and, for some, physical and emotional difficulties as well. It makes sense that we are weary. And we can give ourselves and others compassion during this time.

And ... at the same time ... we also know that this is not the end.

We place our trust in God that this is only a season in our lives and in our world. A season that eventually we will look back on, be amazed how we survived and thrived, and be thankful for the place we are called to next.

Here is how I ended my reflection from ten years ago:

*As I close this blog post, I am reminded of the passing of seasons and the amazing presence of God. When I began treatment, summer was in full bloom. We have gone through the falling of leaves, the dormancy of winter, and are now on the cusp of spring. This is where I feel my body is, too. I am ready to live a new life of health and wholeness, hope and gratitude. Psalm 30:11-12 says it so well: You have turned my mourning into dancing; you have taken off my sackcloth and clothed me with joy, so that my soul may praise you and not be silent. O Lord my God, I will give thanks to you for ever.*

May we rest and may we breathe.

May we live and move and dance in the Spirit.

May we trust that through all things God is present with us – above us, beneath us, before us, and behind us.

May this year bring us resiliency and hope.

May we – *together* – be filled with Christ's love and compassion for one another and for ourselves.



### December 2021 CLC Property Team Accomplishments

1. Set up the stage and risers for the Preschool Christmas practice and program. After the successful presentation, reversed the process and put the stage units back in storage.
2. Adjusted the entrance door closures near the kitchen.
3. Set up the nativity scene adjacent to the church entrance sign. High winds and snow storms required us to reposition some of the taller figures who had taken headers into the snowbanks.
4. Checked building for power outages and any heating problems after the snow storms.
5. Picked up remainder of water hoses and placed in storage.
6. Shovelled snow and made building checks for heat.
8. The kitchen sink water lines stopped operating, and appropriate steps were taken to solve this problem. When temperatures are predicted to go below freezing we should leave the internal kitchen door open and raise the roll-up divider over the kitchen counter so heat can circulate.
9. Called a contractor to clear our parking lot of snow in time for January 2nd service. We still had to shovel sidewalks and spread salt on the access to the church. However, there were still some extremely slippery conditions.


